Dear Stakeholder,

As you are likely aware, the trustees of St. Joseph's College and Ardscoil Mhuire have agreed to amalgamate both schools with a new voluntary Catholic co-educational school opening in September 2025. This amalgamation decision follows an extensive consultation process with stakeholders.

We have recently established a Steering Committee to lead the amalgamation process with nominees from both schools and patrons on this committee. The committee have established a number of Task Forces to manage the process. The *New School Name Task Force* has one distinct objective: In consultation with stakeholders, develop an appropriate name for the new school.

We are now asking the community and stakeholders to submit their ideas for a new school name between Monday 27th November and Friday 8th December 2023. The suggestions should be reflective of one or more of the following guidelines:

- Ballinasloe, its history and/or location
- The history and ethos of the schools from which the new school shall be created
- The Catholic and inclusive ethos of both schools
- A vision for the future of the new school as a reflection of the community

Once the suggestions have been received, they will be shortlisted by the task force, in conjunction with the steering committee and the Trustees/ Patrons. The shortlist of names will be shared with stakeholders once again and you will have the opportunity to vote on your preferred choice. This will take place in January 2024.

Once the process is completed, all those who contributed will be entered into a draw to win €100 Shop Ballinasloe Voucher.

THE CONTEXT

Ballinasloe is the largest town in County Galway after Galway City, and is a prosperous and expanding commercial/industrial centre for East Galway. The 2022 census put the population at just over 6,590.

The town derives its name from the ford of the River Suck near the old Norman castle at River Street, which became a meeting place for the hostings of the Connacht tribesmen, chiefs and warriors of Breifne and Meath. The ford became known as 'Beal Atha na Sluaigheadh' meaning the 'mouth of the ford of Hostings'
